

ORDINANCE NO. 23-44.

Appropriating money for the recreational program of the Bexley Recreation Board for the balance of the year 1944, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That, whereas, the Recreation Board has submitted a proposed recreation program for the fall, winter and spring season of 1944 and 1945, which will require additional monies for salaries and supplies for the period ending January 1st, 1945, estimated at \$900.00 for salaries and \$500.00 for supplies, and Council being of the opinion that said sum should be appropriated for said purposes, there is hereby appropriated from the general fund said sum of \$1400.00 of which amount \$900.00 is appropriated for salaries and \$500.00 for supplies.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said funds are immediately necessary for the continuance of the recreation program, and the same should go into force and effect upon the passage thereof.
