ORDINANCE NO. 25-44

Authorizing the Recreation Board to employ supervisors for the period ending January 1st, 1945, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEGLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whereas the Recreation Board has reported to this Council that it has not to this date employed a recreational director and that it is the desire of said Board to continue its program on a temporary basis by the employment of a head supervisor and such other supervisors as may from time to time be required, all of whom shall be teachers in the Lexley Schools, said Board is hereby autorized to employ one head supervisor at a salary of \$60.00 per month and to employ such other supervisors as may from time to time be necessary, at a salary of \$1.00 per hour for time actually devoted to said recreational program, all of whom shall be teachers in the Bexley Schools.

Schools and said recreational program is to be operated jointly by the City of Bexley and the Board of Education of the Bexley School District, and Council is of the opinion that said teachers are qualified for said positions and said work is temporary and seasonal, said positions shall be exempt from the classified service.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and said ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon the passage thereof.
