

ORDINANCE NO. 29-44


Providing for the purchase of uniforms for members of the police department.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That whereas Council deems it to be to the best interests of the city that it should provide uniforms for the members of the police department so that they may at all times present a neat and uniform appearance, and being of the opinion that in order to obtain the necessary measurements and fittings, the respective purchases should be made by said members of the police department, individually, it is hereby ordained that from and after January 1st, 1945, each member of the police department is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase various articles of clothing constituting their uniforms as prescribed by the Mayor up to, but not exceeding, the sum of \$75.00 per year, and that the invoices for such purchases be made to the City of Bexley, and that the Auditor be and hereby is authorized to honor such invoices up to said amount of \$75.00 for each member of the said police department, and to issue proper vouchers for the payment of such invoices, ut not to exceed \$75.00 in any year.


Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
