## ORDINANCE NO. 9-45

By Mr. Altmaier

Authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to enter into a contract for the purchase of 4 Motorola Model FMT-30D mobile radio transmitters for use of the Department of Public Safety, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Galvin Manufacturing Corporation of Chicago, Illinois, for the purchase of 4 Motorola Model FMT-30D mobile radio transmitters for use of the cruisers operated by the Police Department, at a cost of not to exceed \$300.00, for each such transmitter, for the purchase of which the war Production Board has granted priorities to the City.

Section 2. WHEREAS, these motorola transmitters are necessary in the daily cooperation of the Police Department with the Police Department of the City of Columbus, and such cooperation cannot be obtained by any other make of radio transmitters, and the same can be purchased or obtained only from the above named corporation and cannot be bought elsewhere, and bids could not be made by any other dealer for supplying the same, it would be a useless expenditure of money for advertising for bids for the purchase of such transmitters, and the delay occasioned by advertising might result in failure to obtain the same, the Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to enter into said contract without advertisement.

Section 3. The sum of \$1200.00 is hereby appropriated from the general fund for the above purpose.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety, said emergency being that said transmitters are necessary in the daily operation of the Police Department and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
