

## ORDINANCE NO. 12-45

To amend Section 3 (a) of Ordinance No. 93-31, establishing administrative departments for the City of Bexley, as amended by Ordinance No. 3, passed January 24, 1933, and Ordinance No. 24-44, passed September 26, 1944, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 3 (a) of Ordinance No. 93-31, establishing administrative departments for the City of Bexley, passed December 22nd, 1931, as amended by Ordinance No. 3-33, passed January 24, 1933, and Ordinance No. 24-44, passed September 26, 1944, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3 (a). The Division of Police, or Police Department shall be composed of the following officers and other members who shall receive the respective salaries hereinafter provided.

(1) A Chief of Police who shall be appointed by the Mayor from names or lists submitted by the Civil Service Commission in accordance with law; he shall receive a salary of \$2772.00 per annum, payable semi-monthly.

(2) Three Police Sergeants who shall be appointed by the Mayor from names or lists submitted by the Civil Service Commission in accordance with law; each shall receive a salary of \$2310.00 per annum, payable semi-monthly.

(3) Not to exceed twelve patrolmen, who shall be appointed by the Mayor from lists submitted by the Civil Service Commission in accordance with law; the salaries of said patrolmen shall be dependent upon their length of service, and shall be as follows, to-wit:

For the first year, \$1848.00 per annum, payable semi-monthly. For the second year and thereafter, \$2178.00 per annum, payable semi-monthly.

Provided, however, such persons as have been continuously in the service of the municipality for two years immediately preceding the first day of January, 1932, may be appointed to this Department to serve until discharged, reduced, promoted or transferred in accordance with the provisions of the Charter. The duties of the Chief and other members of the Department shall be as prescribed by the Charter and the statutes of Ohio, or by ordinance of Council hereafter enacted. They shall also serve notices and enforce the rules and regulations of the Board of Health and other Boards, as directed by the Mayor, and shall maintain and keep in good condition all police automobiles, motorcycles, radios, and other equipment

used by this Department. They shall also perform such duties in connection with the Fire Department as may be required by the Mayor or Chief of the Fire Department until otherwise provided by ordinance.

Section 7. That said Section 3 (a) of Ordinance 93-31, Ordinance No. 3-33, and Ordinance No. 24-44, passed September 26, 1944, and all other ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and shall go into immediate effect.
