

ORDINANCE NO. 21-45

Providing for modifying contract for resurfacing and repairing various streets in the City of Bexley, and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, on the 19th day of June, 1945, the City entered into a contract with B. F. Patterson for the repairing and resurfacing of the following streets, to-wit:

Ardmore Road, from Fair Avenue to Broad Street;
 Cassingham Road from Elm Avenue to approximately 200 feet north of Denver Avenue;
 Cassingham Road, from Livingston Avenue to Main Street;
 Roosevelt Avenue, from Livingston Avenue to Main Street;
 Grandon Avenue, from ~~Main Street~~ ^{LIVINGSTON AVENUE} to Charles Street, and from Astor Avenue to Mound Street;
 Chelsea Avenue, from Livingston Avenue to Charles Street, and from Astor Avenue to Mound Street; and,

whereas, during the progress of said work, it was first discovered after the removal of the old asphalt surface that the gutter portion of the existing concrete curb and gutter on part of said streets was in such condition as to require the removal and rebuilding of a much greater portion of the curbs and gutters than was originally estimated to be necessary, and,

whereas, the greater part of the curb is still in good condition, and it is estimated by the engineers that it would be more economical to construct additional thickness of pavement tapering from a standard thickness at the center of the street to the edges, so that the gutter portion of the curb and gutter could be covered with approximately 1½ inches of bituminous concrete, than it would be to remove and rebuild the entire curb and gutter where said gutters are now unserviceable, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a modification of said contract with said B. F. Patterson so as to provide for the laying of an additional thickness of pavement in said streets and tapering same from standard thickness at the center to the

edges thereof, and to cover the gutters with bituminous concrete approximately $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in thickness without removing such portions of curb as may still be serviceable, at such places on any of said streets as in the opinion of the engineers and of the Mayor may be necessary.

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said streets are now in impassable condition and in need of immediate repair and said ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon passage thereof.
