(e) William Walters and Nellie Walters, Deed Book 1313, Page 161.


WHEREAS, it will be for the best interest of the City to accept said conveyances for the uses and purposes above mentioned, NOW THEREFORE,


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


