

ORDINANCE NO. 46-46

Providing for certain changes in the Jeffrey Mansion Building and declaring an emergency.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to contract for and purchase the necessary materials therefore, and to make the necessary alterations in the rear room on the second floor of the Jeffrey Mansion in Jeffrey Park, to place the same in living condition for the occupancy by the Director of Recreation, by installing cabinets, sinks, necessary plumbing, partitions, and other minor changes necessary or proper for that purpose. That whereas no portion of said work will require the expenditure to exceed \$500.00, said contracts shall be let without publication.

Section 2. That the sum of \$850.00 is appropriated from the General Fund for the above purpose.


Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety; said emergency being that the residence of said Service Director in said premises is necessary for the proper operation of his Department and this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
