ORDINANCE NO. 24-47

Providing for the purchase of a Vacuum Leaf Loader and Street Cleaner for the collection of leaves on the public streets and grounds of the City of Bexley, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract, after advertisement according to law, for the purchase of one Vacuum Leaf Loader and Street Cleaner, the same to be equipped with radiator cooled gasoline engine with electric starter, generator, six-volt battery, with clutch, mounted on trailer with pneumatic tires, with special flexible hose on suction side of blower, with flexible rake attached to suction nozzle, including necessary tubes and hose, and an extra tube or hose and nozzle for sidewalk cleaning. Successful bidder to agree to furnish complete and detailed blueprint for the building of light steel framework covering of expanded metal adjusted to fit city truck, which will receive and retain the leaves as sucked from the street. Said complete loader and street cleaner to cost not to exceed \$3,000.00.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law. The sum of \$5,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. Thos ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the season of falling leaves is approaching and said equipment is necessary for the protection of the sewer system of the city, and the same shall go into full force and effect upon the passage thereof.
