ORDINANCE NO. 29-47

Authorizing the purchase of two trucks for municipal uses and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and the Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one one and one-half ton truck with closed cab and dump body as set forth in specifications on file in the Mayor's office, same not to exceed \$3,000.00 in cost, and to exchange thereon either one of used International trucks, Motor No. HD3 12125, Serial No. C 30-11727 or Motor No. HD3-11507, Serial No. C 30-11334; and for the purchase of one two ton truck with closed cab and dumping body as set forth in specifications on file in the Mayor's office, same not to exceed \$3,000.00 in price and to exchange thereon either one of used International trucks, Motor No. HD3-11507, Serial No. C 30-11334 or Motor No. HD3 12125, Serial No. C 30-11727.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement had according to law. The sum of \$6,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said trucks are necessary for the daily operations of the City's governmental functions and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
