ORDINANCE NO. 7-48

By Mr. Altmaier

Prohibiting the giving of false police or fire calls or reports, and providing penalty therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whoever gives or assists in giving a false call or report to the police or fire department, or to any person, firm or corporation operating an ambulance, either in person, or by telephone, or telegraph, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars, and costs of prosecution

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
