

ORDINANCE NO. 40-48

By Mr. Kurtz

Authorizing the purchase of two trucks for municipal uses and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and the Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of one one-half ton truck, pickup, panel or closed, with standard equipment, one windshield wiper, spare wheel, and heater for use of the Water Department, the same not to exceed \$2000.00 in cost, and to exchange thereon one 1936 Chevrolet coupe, Engine No. M 5654386, Serial No. 9 FC-05-23463; and for the purchase of one three-quarter ton pickup truck with standard equipment, one windshield wiper, spare wheel, and heater for use in the general operations of the municipality, the same not to exceed \$2000.00 in cost, and to exchange thereon one 1928 Ford roadster, Motor No. A 54953.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law. The sum of \$4000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said trucks are necessary for the daily operation of the City's governmental functions and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
