

RESOLUTION NO. 2-49

Appointing a Justice of the Peace for Bexley Township,
Franklin County, Ohio.

Whereas, by reason of the death of A. C. Kuhn on the 20th
day of January, 1949 there exists a vacancy in the office of the
Justice of the Peace in Bexley Township and the corporate limits
of the City of Bexley are identical with those of said Township,
NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Thomas V. Dickens, residing at 126 South
Stanwood Road, Bexley, Ohio in the City of Bexley, Township of
Bexley, Franklin County, Ohio, a qualified resident of said Town-
ship, is hereby appointed Justice of the Peace in and for said
Township to fill the vacancy caused by the death of A. C. Kuhn,
to serve until the next regular election for Justice of the Peace,
and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 2. That the Clerk shall notify the Clerk of
Courts of Franklin County, Ohio of such vacancy and the date when
it occurred, and shall certify a copy of this resolution to said
Clerk.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect and be in
force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
