

## ORDINANCE NO. 14-50

Providing for the construction of a building for public halls and municipal offices, and for the use of the departments of Public Service and Public Safety, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO: Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. THAT, WHEREAS, it is necessary to construct a building for public halls and municipal offices, and for the use of the departments of Public Service and Public Safety, and the various divisions thereof, inclusive of Police and Fire, and the Planning Commission has by resolution, duly adopted, approved the plans and specifications for such building heretofore prepared by Inscho, Brand and Inscho, Architects, employed by the City for that purpose, and has approved the location of such building on the grounds heretofore acquired at and adjacent to No. 2242 E. Main Street, in said City, and has approved the size, height, style and general appearance of such building, it is hereby determined to proceed with the construction of such building, and necessary appurtenances, on said premises at No. 2242 E. Main Street and adjacent thereto, all in accordance with the plans, specifications, profiles and estimates heretofore prepared by said Architects and on file in the Office of the Mayor, which said plans, specifications, profiles and estimates are hereby approved.

Section 2. That the Mayor shall appoint a commission to be known as the Building Commission, which shall be composed of said Mayor, who shall be chairman thereof, and three citizens of the City, who may or may not be officers of the said City, and who shall be confirmed by Council. Said commissioners shall serve without compensation.

Said Building Commission shall in cooperation with the Architects have supervision of the construction of said building, shall approve all bills for said construction upon the estimates to be furnished by said Architects, and payment shall be by vouchers issued by

the Auditor.


Section 3. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to make advertisement according to law for bids for said construction, which bids shall be tabulated by said Architects, in accordance with their said contract of employment, and award of contract or contracts shall be made by said Building Commission. All contracts shall be entered into in the name of the City of Bexley, and shall be signed by the Mayor and Auditor.

Section 4. That the sum of \$300,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the cost of said construction and the supervision thereof by said Architects.


Section 5. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the present municipal buildings are entirely inadequate for the proper conduct of the City's business, and said ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage.
