ORDINANCE NO. 25-50

To amend Section 4 of Ordinance No. 14-50, providing for the construction of a building for public halls and municipal offices, passed April 25, 1950, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. THAT, WHEREAS, based upon bills received, it is now estimated that the entire cost of the public building to be constructed under authority of Ordinance No. 14-50, will be approximately \$254,330.00 and that there is a balance of approximately \$10,163.54 owing for architects' fees in connection with the said construction, making a total cost of approximately \$264, 493.54 and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the cost of the portions of said building which are to be constructed for or used in the operation of the Department of Water of the City, will amount to \$48,815.00.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED that Section 4 of said Ordinance No. 14-50 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. The sum of \$48,815.00 is hereby appropriated from the Water Fund for the construction of that portion of said building which is to be constructed for and used in the operation of the Department of Water, and the sum of \$215,678.54 is appropriated from the General Fund to pay the remaining cost of said construction and supervision thereof by the architects."

Section 2. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the present municipal building is entirely inadequate for the proper conduct of municipal business, and said building should be constructed without unnecessary delay, and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its passage.
