ORDINANCE NO. 33-50

Authorizing the purchase and installation of traffic control signal lights at the intersection of Remington Road with Maryland Avenue and the intersection of Cassady Road with Maryland Avenue, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That a traffic control signal light shall be erected at each of the following intersections, to-wit:

The intersection of Remington Road with Maryland Avenue, and the intersection of Cassady Road with Maryland Avenue; and that the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of such traffic control signal lights, and to cause the same to be installed at the above locations.

Section 2. The sum of \$900.00 is hereby appropriated from the Safety Fund for the above purpose.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that a serious traffic hazard exists at each of the above locations, and for which the same shall go into immediate force and effect.
