Providing for limited parking on the streets and highways hereinafter named.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle, being any such vehicle as is defined by the Uniform Traffic Code of Ohio, between the hours of eight o'clock A. M. and six o'clock P. M. for a period longer than two hours, on any of the following streets or parts of streets, to-wit:

- (a) Main Street, from the east line of College Avenue to the west line of Remington Road;
- (b) Drexel Avenue, from a point 56 feet, 6 inches north of Main Street to Sherwood Road; provided, however, such parking in front of the Post Office shall not exceed fifteen minutes;
- (c) Dawson Avenue, from Main Street to the first alley north of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (d) Cassady Road, from Main Street to the first alley north of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (e) Cassingham Road, from Main Street to the first alley north of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (f) Cassingham Road, from Main Street to the first alley south of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (g) Pleasant Ridge Avenue, from Main Street to the first alley south of Main Street, east side thereof;
- (h) Euclaire Avenue, from Main Street to the first alley south of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (i) Montrose Avenue, from Main Street to the first alley south of Main Street, west side thereof;
- (j) The alley west of Euclaire Avenue, from Main Street to the first alley south of Main Street.

Provided, however, that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to Sundays and holidays, and provided further that nothing herein contained shall be construed or held to permit parking on any part of said streets or highways heretofore by any ordinance designated as non-parking areas.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to place and maintain such traffic control devices upon said streets and highways as he may deem necessary to indicate and carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$ 25<sup>00</sup>, together with the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
