Providing for the purchase of Traffic Signal lights and controls, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase of four traffic signal lights, with controls, for installation at the following places, to wit:

The intersections of Fair Avenue with Cassady Road and Roosevelt Avenue.

The intersection of Broad Street with South Roosevelt Avenue.

The intersection of Main Street with Pleasant Ridge Avenue,

as provided in Ordinance No. 30-51.

Section 2. That, whereas it would be futile and a useless expenditure of money to require advertisement for bids for such apparatus and equipment, for the reason that the type required is manufactured by and is obtainable from but one source, and it would therefore be impossible to secure competitive bids therefor, it is hereby ordained and directed that said contracts of purchase be entered into for the lowest prices obtainable, without advertisement.

Section 3. That the sum of \$2,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Gasoline fund for such purchase.

Section 4. That this ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, there being present traffic hazards at the above intersections, and the same shall go into full force and effect upon the passage thereof.
