By Mr. Linscott

Declaring it necessary to improve Columbus Avenue from Stanwood Road to the east corporation line in the manner here-inafter described, and declaring an emergency. .

Whereas, a petition in writing subscribed by all the owners being more than three-fourths in interest of the owners or the owners of sixty per cent of the foot frontage of property abutting upon Columbus Avenue from Stanwood Road and the east corporation line, in the manner hereinbelow described, said petitioners therein consenting that the entire cost of said improvement except only such portion thereof as is by law chargeable against the City may be assessed and collected in equal installments proportioned to the whole assessment, in the manner which may be fixed by Council.

Said petitioners further consenting and requesting that said assessments may be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the petitioners, and waiving all benefits or provisions of the General Code of Ohio limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third percent (33-1/3%) of the value of the property assessed for any and all purposes within the period of fixe years, and also waiving the provisions of the General Code providing for the service and publication of notices of the proceedings for the construction of said improvement and making and levying of assessments therefor; Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO, Three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Avenue from Stanwood Road to the east corporation line by grading and paving the roadway thereof with concrete base, with bituminous concrete surface, constructing concrete curbs and gutters, necessary drains to provide drainage for said improvement, installing water taps and constructing side-walks on each side thereof, in accordance

with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the engineers and now on file in the Office of the Mayor, which plans, specifications, estimates and profiles are hereby approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said street and curbs as improved shall be as shown by the engineer's plans and profiles, which are made a part hereof, and which are on file in the Office of the Mayor.

Section 3. That the entire cost of said improvement, less 2% thereof and the cost of intersections and fire hydrants, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: all lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement, in an amount not less than the cost thereof, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, and of the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of said notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes and bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and of all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the appearments so to be levied shall be paid in 10 annual install to the interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof, provided that the owner of any property assessed may at his option pay such assessment is cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance.

Section 5. That the bonds of the City of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments by installments and in an amount equal thereto, and notes of said City shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds.

Section 6. That the remainder of the entire cost of said improvement shall be paid by the City, for which purpose the sum of \$225.00 is hereby appropriated from the general fund.

Section 7. This resolution is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said street is in a condition dangerous to public traffic and should be immediately improved, and said resolution shall go into immediate force and effect.
