

ORDINANCE NO. 26-53

Providing for the alteration of the plans and specifications for the street lighting improvement, and for the type constant current transformers, and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it has become necessary to the completion and operation of the improvement for a lighting system for streets and parts of streets in the City, as provided in Ordinance No. 15-52, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed February 26, 1952, as well as of the existing system of lighting, that the present two transformers be replaced by two transformers of greater size and power, and that one such transformer be purchased to keep in stock for emergency use, and that the plans and specifications for said improvement be amended to show the same, Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the engineers be instructed to amend the plans and specifications for the improvement for lighting certain streets and parts of streets, as provided in Ordinance No. 15-52, so as to provide for larger transformers, as hereinafter described.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they are hereby authorized, after advertisement according to law, to enter into a contract for the purchase of three 30 K.W. moving coil type constant current transformers, rated at 6.6 Amps, for operation on a 7620 volt, 60 cycle, 3 phase, 4 wire circuit. Transformers shall conform to all applicable A.I.E.E. and A.S.A. standards. It shall have pole type case, grounding stud and drain plug, less hanger irons.

Section 3. That the cost of two of said transformers shall be charged to and paid out of the appropriations for said improvement of which 19% shall be paid out of the City's portion and 81% shall be paid out of the assessment portion, and one thereof shall be paid for out of the general fund, and that in accordance therewith there be, and hereby is appropriated for the cost of two of said transformers out of the funds for said improvement the sum of \$2600.00 at the above ratio of 81% and 19% respectively to the assessment and City's portions of said improvement funds, and there is appropriated out of the general fund for the cost of one of said transformers, the sum of \$1300.00.

Section 4. That this ordinance is an emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that many of said streets are poorly lighted and in dangerous condition, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
