

ORDINANCE No. 17-54

Prohibiting the practice of going in and upon private residences by solicitors, peddlers and others, not having been invited or having permission to do so, for the purpose of selling merchandise or services.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. The practice of going in and upon private residences or property in the City of Bexley, Ohio, by anyone, or by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise, periodicals, and services, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise, magazines, periodicals, or services, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same, without first having registered his or her name and address, and the article or thing which he or she intends to sell or solicit for and obtained permission from the Mayor or Police Department, is hereby declared to be a nuisance and to constitute a misdemeanor, and is hereby prohibited.

Section 2. Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
