

ORDINANCE NO. 23-61

Requiring all vehicles to stop at all entrances to the street intersection hereinafter set forth, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whereas, by reason of the hazardous traffic conditions existing with regard to both vehicular and pedestrian traffic at the intersection of East Mound Street and South Roosevelt Avenue, the operator of any vehicle on any intersecting highway at such intersection shall bring his vehicle to a full stop before crossing or entering upon such intersection; subject, however, to the direction of any police officer or traffic control signal at such intersection.

The Mayor shall erect stop signs on all highways entering any such intersection, at the entrance thereto. Every such sign shall bear the word "STOP" in letters not less than six inches in height. Every stop sign shall be located as near as practicable at the property line of the highway at such entrance at which the stop must be made, or at the nearest line of the crosswalk thereat, or if none, at the nearest line of the roadway.

Section 2. The foregoing provisions shall in no way be construed to designate the above named highways as "through highways", as defined in Section 61 of the Ordinance No. 30-51.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed fifty dollars, and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the public peace, health and safety, in that by reason of the location of schools at said intersection, the same are hazardous both to pedestrian and vehicular traffic, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
