

ORDINANCE NO. 18-62

Providing for the purchase of an automobile for the use of the Department of Public Safety and a Packer type refuse body and automobile chassis therefore, for collection of garbage and refuse and a small coupe for the use of the Building and Street Department, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they are hereby authorized, to enter into a contract for the purchase of one (1) new two-door sedan, complete with standard equipment, 2 windshield wipers; heavy duty generator adaptable to police cruiser work; heavy duty battery to operate radio and other equipment (bidder shall specify if 6 or 12 volt battery; also quote on both types if practical); spare wheel and tire; deluxe heater; speedometer; automatic gear shift, two arm-rests; rear compartment or trunk space to accommodate Red Cross Equipment, the same not to exceed \$2,500.00 in cost. No trade. Also, for the purchase of one (1) Packer type refuse body and chassis for same, for use in the collection of garbage and refuse, said body type to be fully enclosed and designed to obtain the utmost in the way of sanitary conditions and construction, the same to be fully equipped for use according to specifications, as the Mayor may deem proper and best and to exchange thereon one (1) 1952 Federal Refuse Truck, Garwood Packer type body, Motor No. 1726126, Serial No. 155989, the same not to exceed \$13,000.00 and for the purchase of one (1) two-door small coupe with wheelbase not to exceed 112" for use in the building and street department, City reserves right to select the car it considers most adaptable for the service it is to render, same not to exceed \$2,200.00. No trade.

Section 2. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bid after advertisement according to law. The sum of \$2,500.00 is hereby appropriated from the Safety Fund and \$15,200.00 is appropriated from the General Fund for the purposes aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that said Departments are in need of said automobiles and truck and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.
