BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That a public hearing be held on Tuesday, November 26, 1968 at 7:00 P.M. in the city Municipal Building to discuss and consider the ordinance to permit the erection of multiple dwellings on the unimproved tract on the south side of East Broad Street between Merkle Road and Gould Road.

Section 2. That the Clerk shall order the publication of a notice of the time and place of said public hearing, in a newspaper of general circulation in the city, said notice to be published at least thirty (30) days before the date of the hearing.

Section 3. That the Clerk shall give at least twenty (20) days written notice of the time and place of said meeting by first class mail to the owners of property within and contiguous to and directly across the street from the above property, mailed to the addresses of such owners appearing on the county auditor's current tax list or the treasurer's mailing list.

Section 4. That from the date of the notice until the date of the hearing, copies of the proposed ordinance shall be on file, for public examination, in the office of the Mayor.
