

By W. B. Clark ORDINANCE NO. 4-70

To authorize the Mayor as Director of Public Service to purchase a new Addressograph Imprinting Machine without advertising and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, there is a real and present emergency because our Addressograph Imprinting Machine is no longer usable due to age and condition; and

WHEREAS, our system of preparing and mailing water bills requires the use of Addressograph equipment unless we replace all of our equipment and adopt another method; and

WHEREAS, there is only one company that manufactures and sells this equipment; and

WHEREAS, there is an eight week delivery delay on the equipment we need and the water bills have to be mailed in April; and

WHEREAS, there is a six percent increase in the cost of the equipment we need, which is effective February 1, 1970, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor, as the Director of Public Service, be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a contract with Addressograph Multi-graph Corporation to purchase the following:

1 - Model 1800 Imprinting Machine	\$1,832.50
1 - Semi-automatic form ejector	88.00
1 - Automatic envelope feeder	<u>790.00</u>
	\$2,710.50

Section 2. That this ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being described above, and said ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
