

ORDINANCE NO. 23-74

To regulate exterior lighting

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO

Section 1. No lights of the type commonly used for lighting grounds around farm homes and which are currently being offered by the Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company on a rental basis and designated "private area lights" shall hereafter be erected in this City, until The Board of Zoning Appeals has approved the location and operation of the same, after considering whether or not the proposed light is reasonable and will not be detrimental to nearby property or the occupants thereof. The Board may require notice to all residents within 200 feet of the property on which the light is requested.

Section 2. No person shall permit the continued operation of the type light described in Section 1. hereof, whether now in operation or hereafter approved as provided above, unless it is arranged and shielded to reflect the light away from the nearby property of any owner or tenant who objects to the same and is affected by it.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
