

ORDINANCE NO. 17 -75

To regulate exterior lighting

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO

Section 1. No lights of the type commonly used for lighting grounds around farm homes and which are currently being offered by the Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company on a rental basis and designated "private area lights" shall hereafter be erected in this City, until an application has been filed and all residents within 200 feet have been notified by mail. ^{By the City.} Such notice shall advise each person that if there is no objection within 7 days, a permit will be issued, and that if there is an objection, there will be a hearing at the next meeting of the Board of Zoning Appeals at which the objector should be present to discuss the objection. At such hearing the Board may take whatever action it deems advisable.

Section 2. No person shall permit the continued operation of the type light described in Section 1 hereof, whether now in operation or hereafter approved as provided above, unless it is arranged and shielded to reflect the light away from the nearby property of any owner or tenant who objects to the same and is affected by it.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. Ordinance No. 23-74 is hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
