

ORDINANCE NO. 28 -75

To increase the number of patrolmen in the police department.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That in accordance with the powers granted this Council by Section 45 of the charter, the number of patrolmen in the police department is hereby increased from 18 to 19.

Section 2. That the salary for the additional patrolman shall be the same as the salary authorized for new officers.

Section 3. That the purpose of increasing the number of patrolmen is to permit the designation of one of the patrolmen as The Park Patrolman to serve exclusively in and around the Jeffrey grounds and Commonwealth Park from Memorial day to Labor day, Monday thru Friday, at such hours as may be designated by the Chief of Police.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

To authorize the Mayor to purchase a new truck body to replace a ruined body on service vehicle number 19, and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a contract without advertising and bidding, for the purchase of a truck body at least ten (10) feet long and six and one-half (6 1/2) feet wide, to replace the body on truck number 19 of the service fleet which is rusted and broken through, and the maximum amount that may be paid as the purchase price for the same is hereby determined to be ~~\$2,800.00~~
2,500.00

Section 2. That the sum of ~~\$2,800.00~~ # 2,500.00 be appropriated from the General Fund and credited to the Street Maintenance Repair Fund to cover the cost of the purchase of the above specified truck body.

Section 3. That this ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being that the City is without the necessary number of operating trucks for maintenance, leaf pickup and salting of streets, and this ordinance may go into immediate force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
