

RESOLUTION

ADOPTING THE "WATERCOURSE PLAN FOR COLUMBUS AND FRANKLIN COUNTY"

WHEREAS, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission adopted the Franklin County Comprehensive Plan on December 17, 1969, and thereby established a goal of preserving land for open space by utilizing the flood plains branching throughout the urban area, and

WHEREAS, the communities of Franklin County were requested to provide letters of support for an application by the City of Columbus, Recreation and Parks Department, to obtain funding for a Watercourse Study of Franklin County, and

WHEREAS, the "Watercourse Plan for Columbus and Franklin County" has been completed by the consultants, Labrenz-Riemer, Inc. and the Ohio State University's School of Architecture, Division of Landscape Architects, and

WHEREAS, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission hosted a Seminar on May 29, 1975, to acquaint community representatives with the Watercourse Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission adopted the Watercourse Plan on June 19, 1975, and has certified a copy of said Plan to this municipality in accordance with Section 713.24 of the Revised Code, and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code, Section 713.25, provides that the Planning Commission of any municipal corporation to which a regional or county plan is certified under Section 713.24 of the Revised Code, may adopt such plan, and it shall thereupon have the same force within the municipal corporation as is provided by law or charter for plans prepared and adopted by the local planning commission, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1: That it hereby ^{RECOGNIZES} adopts the "Watercourse Plan for Columbus and Franklin County".
