ORDINANCE NO. 3 -77

To amend Ordinance No. 7-76 in regards to Holidays and rates of pay, effective January 1, 1977, and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. This section amends Section 4 of Ordinance No. 7-76 by adding an additional Holiday for Columbus Day as celebrated by the Federal Government. This shall be considered a paid holiday.

Section 2. This section amends Schedule I of Ordinance No. 7-76 by inserting the following schedule of wages for the Police Department. These new wages are effective January 1, 1977.
