WHEREAS, individuals often avoid seeking proper medical care and suffer needlessly out of fear and shame, thereby creating even more severe medical problems; and

WHEREAS, continued public awareness and education are the keys to preventing and containing the epidemics of STDs; and

WHEREAS, the VD Hotline has made significant contributions to the STD control program in Columbus by providing the community with factual information and referral services, guiding them to a better understanding of sexually transmissible diseases;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

VD Awareness Week, to reinforce our commitment to the continuing efforts leading to the control and eventual eradication of these major health problems, with the hope that this year's campaign might also plant the seed of change in attitudes about STDs.
