

ORDINANCE NO. 25-83

An Ordinance to appropriate funds for Capital Improvements for the 1983 fiscal year.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the sum of \$9,825.00 be transferred from the unencumbered General Fund to the Street Maintenance and Repair Fund and set aside and appropriated from that fund to be used for the resurfacing with asphaltic concrete of the following streets:

Plymouth Avenue	Cassady	Dawson

Section 2. That the sum of \$59,544.00 be set aside and appropriated from the unencumbered Street Maintenance Fund, Account number 400-50, for the purpose of conducting the 1983 Permissive License Tax Project which will consist of resurfacing Drexel Avenue from East Main Street to Clifton Avenue with Slurry Seal and Traffic Signal Improvements at the intersections of Maryland Avenue and North Remington Road and South Cassingham Road and East Mound Street.

Section 3. That the sum of \$10,500.00 be appropriated and set aside from the unencumbered General Fund for the purpose of purchasing one (1) new economy size truck in the Service Department.

Section 4. That the sum of \$5,000.00 be appropriated and set aside from the unencumbered General Fund for the purpose of site improvements and landscaping at the new Municipal Parking Lot, conditioned, however, that said funds shall not be used until the successful acquisition of the property by the City.

Section 5. That the sum of \$3,200.00 be appropriated and set aside from the unencumbered General Fund for the purpose of making landscaping improvements at the Stanbery Circle.

Section 6. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into contracts for the purchase of the necessary equipment, materials, and labor, specifically identified in the five (5) previous sections, the total cost of which shall not exceed the sums so specified and appropriated in each section, and the complete specifications for which have been prepared and are on file in the office of the Mayor.

Section 7. Said contract shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law, where bidding is required by law.

Section 8. That this Ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and this Ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
