

AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 46-83

An Ordinance to formally reinstate Officer Robert Buty to his status as a police officer of the City of Bexley as of the date of his resignation in October, 1982 and to provide credit for seniority earned prior to such resignation for present salary purposes, to reinstate to him as of the effective date of this Ordinance any and all unpaid vacation time and any and all earned but unused sick leave accumulated by him prior to such resignation and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That Officer Robert Buty of the Bexley Police Department, who had resigned from the Department in October, 1982, be and he hereby is, formally reinstated to his rank of patrolman effective as of August 1, 1983, with credit for all seniority earned by him, prior to the date of his resignation, plus the additional seniority earned by him since his initial reinstatement and his return to work in November of 1982.

Section 2. That Officer Robert Buty further be given credit on his official pay records for all accumulated but unused sick leave accredited to him at the time of his resignation and any earned but unreimbursed vacation time or personal days at the time of his resignation;

Section 3. That Officer Buty shall acquire no other rights or benefits from his employment otherwise denied to him because of his resignation and initial reinstatement to entry level status, without longevity, and his employment in that capacity from reinstatement to the time of passage of this Ordinance except as set forth herein;

Section 4. That this Ordinance is an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 46 -83

An ordinance to formally reinstate officer Robert Buty to his status as a police officer of the City of Bexley as of the time of his resignation in October 1982, to provide for seniority earned prior to resignation for salary purposes, for any unpaid vacation time, and for accumulated but unused sick leave and to appropriate funds.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY,
OHIO:

Section 1. That officer Robert Buty of the Bexley Police Department who resigned from the Department in October 1982, be formally reinstated to his rank of patrolman with credit for all seniority earned prior to his resignation as of the date of his official reinstatement and his return to work in November 1982;

Section 2. That officer Robert Buty further be given credit on his official pay records for all accumulated but unused sick leave accredited to him at the time of his resignation and any earned but unreimbursed vacation time or personal days at the time of his resignation;

Section 3. That officer Buty shall acquire no other rights or benefits from his employment otherwise denied to him because of his resignation and initial reinstatement to entry level status, without longevity, and his employment in that capacity from reinstatement to the time of passage of this Ordinance except as set forth herein;

Section 4. That the sum of \$4,550.66 be appropriated and set aside from the unencumbered General Fund and then to be paid to officer Robert Buty, or on his account, for the differential in salary and wages earned by him at the reinstated salary level since his return to work in November 1982;

Section 5. That the sum of \$839.60 be appropriated and set aside from the unencumbered General Fund and paid into the Police Pension Fund on behalf of officer Buty for the increased salary and wages earned by him since his return to work as a result of his reinstatement to his former status;

Section 6. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
