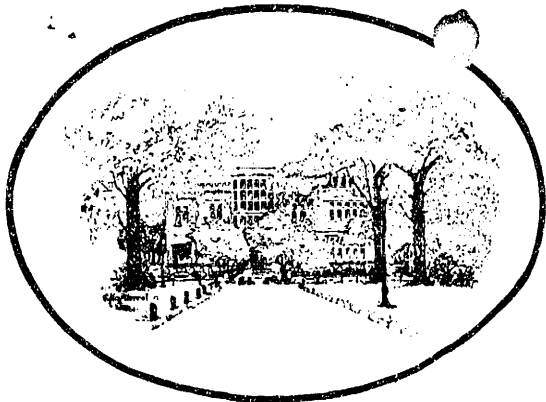

RESTRICTIONS FOR AMERIFLORA '92

The City of Bexley has set certain restrictions for the use of Jeffrey Mansion and Park. They are:

Full use of Tennis courts maintained.
Use of City pool maintained including parking lot.
All of park and mansion returned to previous condition except for any residuals or improvements that City of Bexley and AmeriFlora agree upon.

RESIDUALS

At the original meeting with Director Barney and Dr. John Peterson, we were told to list some residuals that the City of Bexley has in mind at this time. We realize that these are only ideas that may or may not come to reality as AmeriFlora '92 approaches.

Some trees and plantings, flower beds, etc.
Improvements to trail system in woods.
Identification and/or marking of trees.
Playground equipment according to future needs in park.
Shelter and bathroom facility in park.
Renovation of portion of mansion used by AmeriFlora.
Improvements to outdoor lighting system.
Amphitheatre in north end.
Improvements to road system in park.
