

ORDINANCE NO. 18 - 86

An Ordinance to authorize the transfer of funds from the unencumbered General Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund, to appropriate funds from the Capital Improvements Fund and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the sum of \$182,000.00 be and it hereby is, transferred from the unencumbered General Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund.

Section 2. That the sum of \$182,000.00 be and it hereby is, appropriated from the unencumbered General Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund for the 1986 Street Renovation Program as follows:

ASPHALTIC OVERLAY: Bellwood Avenue from East Corporation Line to Cassady; Bryden Road from Remington to Drexel; Columbus Avenue from East Corporation Line to Cassady; Dale Avenue from Dawson to Westland; Elm Avenue from Gould to Roosevelt; Merkle Road from Fair to Powell; Northview Avenue from Maryland to Delmar; Parkhill Drive from Westland to Park Drive; Plymouth Avenue from Merkle to Roosevelt; Roosevelt Avenue from Maryland to North Corporation Line; Stanbery Drive from Cassady to Kuhl; Stanwood Road from Kuhl to Allegheny.

SLURRY SEAL: Roosevelt Avenue from Main to Broad; and Vernon Road from Livingston to Main.

Section 3. That the Mayor and the Auditor be, and they hereby are, authorized to enter into an agreement with Canal Ltd., dba; Marclay Square Apartments, to provide for reimbursement to the City of Bexley for parking improvements to be accomplished to the North Stanwood Road and Bellwood Avenue right-of-ways, said improvements are to be done with the North Stanwood Road resurfacing in accordance with the design plan approved by the Bexley Planning Commission.

Section 4. That the Mayor and the Auditor be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the improvements as specified in Sections 2 and 3 hereof, the total cost of which shall not exceed the amount specified and appropriated.

Section 5. That the contracts authorized herein, when required by law, shall be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law.

Section 6. That this Ordinance is an Emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and therefore, shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
