

ORDINANCE NO. 31 - 88

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 1440 of the Bexley Codified Ordinances, to provide for a moratorium on the installation of any exterior lighting which exceeds 150 watts per light, for the period of April 26, 1988 through May 31, 1988, and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, Chapter 1440 of the Bexley Codified Ordinances provides a process for the approval of high intensity discharge lights for exterior uses; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Chapter 1440 of the Bexley Codified Ordinances to provide a reasonable use of such lighting and to protect the quiet enjoyment of nearby properties by their occupants; and,

WHEREAS, newly developed exterior lighting is not addressed in Chapter 1440 of the Bexley Codified Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, said exterior lighting may shine, glare, reflect or be diverted into or toward any premise with a degree of brightness that may be detrimental or disturbing to the comfort or repose of other persons; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1: That a moratorium on the installation of any exterior lighting which exceeds 150 watts per light is in effect from April 26, 1988 through May 31, 1988.

Section 2: That this Ordinance is an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and therefore, said Ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
