

ORDINANCE NO. 66-89

An Ordinance to transfer \$48,000 from the unencumbered General Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund, to appropriate \$16,000 from the Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of furniture and fixtures for Jeffrey Mansion, to appropriate \$32,000 from the Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of a new telephone system and related expenses, to appropriate \$6,000 from the Water Fund for the purchase of computer hardware for the Water Department, to appropriate \$933 from the unencumbered General Fund for the purchase of holiday decorations, and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That \$48,000 is hereby transferred from the unencumbered General Fund to the Capital Improvements Fund.

Section 2. That \$16,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of furniture and fixtures for Jeffrey Mansion.

Section 3. That \$6,000 is hereby appropriated from the Water Fund for the purchase of computer hardware for the Water Department.

Section 4. That \$32,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of a new telephone system and related expenses.

Section 5. That \$933 is hereby appropriated from the unencumbered General Fund to purchase holiday decorations for Drexel Circle and Jeffrey Mansion.

Section 6. That any contracts required to effect the purchases authorized by this Ordinance shall, when required by law, be entered into with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law.

Section 7. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being the need to provide uninterrupted services to the public, and shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
