

ORDINANCE NO. 2 -90By: J. J. Schmitt

To establish rates of pay for all salaried employees, hourly employees, City Solicitor, civilian Police Department personnel, Police Chief, Police Lieutenant, and Police Sergeants of the City of Bexley, effective as of January 1, 1990, and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the elected officials of the City of Bexley are to be paid in the manner prescribed by the Charter and Ordinances.

Section 2.

A. That the Police Chief, Police Lieutenant, Police Sergeants, Radio Dispatchers, Parking Control Officer, and Dog Warden will be paid according to Schedule I as follows:

The Police Chief, Police Lieutenant and the Police Sergeants will be paid annual salaries as follows:

The civilian employees of the Police Department designated below will be paid annual salaries based upon the stated years of continuous employment as follows:

All Schedule I employees will be paid 26 pays per year.

B. That all full-time salaried employees (except elected officials) will be paid according to Schedule II as follows:

Each of the employees in the foregoing positions on the effective date of this Ordinance will be paid the highest rate specified.

The Supervisors of Recreation are hereby determined by virtue of the duties to be performed by them to be assistant department heads exempt from the Classified service.

The Secretary to the Service Department, Secretary to the Building Department, Secretary to the Recreation Department, Assistant Deputy Auditor, Secretary to the Police Department, Clerk of Courts/Administrative Aide to the Chief of Police, and Water Department Account Clerk 2, will be paid annual salaries based on the stated years of continuous employment as follows:

All Schedule III employees will be paid 52 pays per year.

D. That the City Solicitor, the Health Commissioner, and the Sanitarian will be paid according to Schedule IV as follows:

SCHEDULE IV

The City Solicitor will be paid a retainer of \$13,440 and expenses plus \$60 per hour for representation of the City before the Bexley Mayor's Court and the Bexley Civil Service Commission, to be paid monthly or at the discretion of the Auditor. This annual fee does not include representation in litigation involving the City or the Bexley School District.

The Health Commissioner will be paid an annual salary of \$8,159. Such salary will be paid in 26 pays per year. Notwithstanding the provisions of Ordinance No. 3-86 and Section 4 of Ordinance No. 16-88, the only insurance benefits to which the Health Commissioner is entitled are dental and life insurance.

The Sanitarian will be paid at an hourly rate of \$8.82 per hour. Notwithstanding the provisions of Ordinance No. 3-86 and Section 4 of Ordinance No. 16-88, the Sanitarian shall not be entitled to any insurance benefits.

E. That all part-time, temporary and casual employees other than salaried employees, will be paid according to Schedule V as follows:

Section 3. That the provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect as of January 1, 1990, and the Auditor be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to make a lump sum payment to each employee of any unpaid compensation arising herefrom as soon as practicable after the passage of this Ordinance.

Section 4. That, until and unless changed, the hours of work, working conditions and fringe benefits of all employees of the City of Bexley shall be as set forth in Ordinance No. 3-86 as passed on May 27, 1986, as amended in part by Ordinance No. 61-89.

Section 5. That in order to assure uninterrupted City services, this Ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and this Ordinance shall go into force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
