

ORDINANCE NO. 3 -90

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 2-90 with respect to the salaries of Radio Dispatchers effective as of January 1, 1990 to provide for a lump sum payment of any unpaid salaries retroactive to January 1, 1990, and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 2-90 is hereby amended by deleting Schedule I at Section 2.A in its entirety and substituting the following:

A. That the Police Chief, Police Lieutenant, Police Sergeants, Radio Dispatchers, Parking Control Officer, and Dog Warden will be paid according to Schedule I as follows:

SCHEDULE I

The Police Chief, Police Lieutenant and the Police Sergeants will be paid annual salaries as follows:

<u>CHIEF</u>	\$49,496
<u>LIEUTENANT</u>	\$43,418
<u>SERGEANT</u>	\$38,423

The civilian employees of the Police Department designated below will be paid annual salaries based upon the stated years of continuous employment as follows:

RADIO DISPATCHERS (4):

Beginning 1st year	\$14,827	\$15,568
Beginning 2nd year	\$18,148	19,055
Beginning 3rd year	\$22,141	23,248

PARKING CONTROL OFFICER:

Beginning 1st year	\$15,568
Beginning 2nd year	\$19,055
Beginning 3rd year	\$22,812

DOG WARDEN:

Beginning 1st year	\$15,568
Beginning 2nd year	\$19,055
Beginning 3rd year	\$22,812

All Schedule I employees will be paid 26 pays per year.

Section 2. That the provisions of this Ordinance shall take effect as of January 1, 1990, and the Auditor be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to make a lump sum payment to each employee of any unpaid compensation arising herefrom as soon as practicable after the passage of this Ordinance.

Section 3. That, until and unless changed, the salary, hours of work, working conditions and fringe benefits of all employees of the City of Bexley shall be as provided in Ordinance No. 2-90, as amended in part by this Ordinance.

Section 4. That in order to assure uninterrupted City services, this Ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and this Ordinance shall go into force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
