## Ordinance No. 32-91

An Ordinance to establish an encumbered fund to accept gifts from the Bexley Beautification 1992 Fund of the Columbus Foundation, Inc. and to receive money from other sources for community beautification, to appropriate moneys from such fund as moneys are received from time to time by the City and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Bexley Beautification 1992 Fund of the Columbus Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") has been established to facilitate private fund raising to support community beautification projects in the City; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation will from time to time distribute moneys to the City and the City may also receive moneys from other sources for such purposes, and this Council desires to authorize the Mayor to expend such moneys to accomplish a beautification program substantially in the form described in the report of January, 1991, attached hereto as Exhibit A and to pay the expenses of fund raising activities related thereto (together the "Beautification Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Beautification Program is a public/private effort to enhance the quality of life in the City which involves the efforts of many volunteers and has the full support of the City and this Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1: That the Auditor is authorized and directed to establish an encumbered fund to be designated the "Bexley Beautification 1992 Fund" (the "Fund") to receive gifts from the Foundation and moneys from other sources for the Beautification Program.

Section 2: That all moneys deposited to the Fund are hereby appropriated to pay the costs of the Beautification Program as they are incurred and that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to expend moneys from the Fund for such purpose from time to time to the extent that moneys are available in the Fund.

Section 3: That this Ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being the necessity of paying costs of the Beautification Program, and shall be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
