

ORDINANCE NO. 55-91

An Ordinance to appropriate the amount of \$35,000 from the unencumbered Refuse Fund for the City's share of the cost of a recycling truck and trailer and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City applied for and received a grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the purchase of recycling materials collection equipment; and,

WHEREAS, after extensive research, City staff has determined that a dump truck and compartmentalized trailer is the best collection equipment for the City's recycling program; and,

WHEREAS, the City's share of the cost is approximately \$35,000. NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the sum of \$35,000 is hereby appropriated from the Refuse Fund for the purchase of a recycling truck and trailer.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed, after advertisement according to law, to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder for the purchase of a recycling truck and trailer.

Section 3. That this Ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in order to purchase a recycling truck and trailer at the earliest possible date and shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
