

ORDINANCE NO. 7 -94

An Ordinance to appropriate \$11,022 from the unencumbered General Fund for the purchase of new outdoor warning sirens to be installed at City Hall, to authorize the Mayor and Auditor to execute an agreement on behalf of the City with the Franklin County Emergency Management Agency for the installation and maintenance of the warning system and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That \$11,022 is hereby appropriated from the unencumbered General Fund for the purchase of new outdoor warning sirens.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with the Franklin County Emergency Management Agency in the form attached to this Ordinance and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. That the outdoor warning sirens shall be erected at the Bexley City Hall.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is an emergency measure, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being to provide for the installation and activation of the updated warning system at the earliest possible date, and this Ordinance shall go into force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AGREEMENT

This agreement, made and entered into this 20th day of January,
199⁴8, by and between the City of Bexley
city/village/township

Ohio (hereinafter called the City
city/village/township

and the Franklin County Emergency Management Agency (hereinafter
called FCEMA), pursuant to and as authorized by the Countywide
Agreement. Each party agrees to the following:

WHEREAS: FCEMA shall be responsible for coordinating, organizing,
administering, maintaining and operating the outdoor warning system
within Franklin County, and has complied with and will comply with
all basic laws pertaining to government contracting pursuant to the
Ohio Revised Code, adjudicated case law, and Attorney General
opinions concerning public contracts and competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, The City
city/village/township desires to:

(Circle the letter or letters applicable)

- A Purchase and have installed, new sirens; and/or
- B Relocate designated sirens to newly selected locations;
and/or
- C. Remove from service certain designated sirens in the

city/village/township

Now, therefore, in order to accomplish the foregoing, the parties agree to the following conditions:

The City will provide FCEMA with:
city/village/township

- A. A letter from the Chief Executive/or designee authorizing the purchase.
- B. A copy of the ordinance/resolution appropriating the funds.
- C. A purchase order number.
- D. This signed agreement.

The FCEMA will, upon receipt of all of the above, proceed with the purchase of new sirens and/or remove designated sirens.

Prior to installation, the sirens will be stored at a facility designated by the FCEMA. The FCEMA carries insurance on all sirens in storage and 30 days after installation. After that 30 day period the city/village/township will assume liability.

FCEMA agrees to coordinate the installation, conversion and relocation of new sirens and the maintenance and repair with the following personnel or representative of the City of Bexley:

The actual installation services shall be performed by the subcontractor designated and/or agreed to by FCEMA.

INVOICING AND PAYMENTS

Upon delivery of siren equipment to the location designated in paragraph 3 on page 2, the FCEMA will prepare and send to City of Bexley an itemized invoice which will only be for equipment ordered.

Upon completion of installation and final activation test, the FCEMA will prepare and send to City of Bexley and itemized invoice which will include installation costs, prorated core costs, and all costs necessary to make the siren operational.

The City of Bexley agrees to pay the FCEMA as soon as possible upon receipt of any invoice, but no later than thirty (30) days from date of invoice.

The coordination of maintenance and repair of the outdoor warning system shall be the responsibility of FCEMA. The cost of maintenance and repair shall be the responsibility of the City of Bexley. FCEMA will, after receipt of the maintenance/repair bill(s), invoice the City of Bexley for the expenses.


FCEMA will notify the City of Bexley prior to
city/village/township
any maintenance and/or repair that is unusual or out of the
ordinary.

This agreement may be terminated by either party for good cause by
giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the
event of termination, the FCEMA will be paid on a prorated basis
for work completed. This may involve additional payment to FCEMA
or refund to the City of Bexley. All
city/village/township


purchases made or work completed under this agreement shall be
considered to be the property of the City of Bexley
city/village/township
after payment has been made to FCEMA pursuant to this agreement.
