

ORDINANCE NO. 44-96

An Ordinance to establish an encumbered fund to accept gifts and donations for the purpose of paying costs associated with community events, to appropriate money from such fund as moneys are received from time to time by City and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the Auditor is authorized and directed to establish an encumbered fund to be designated the "Community Events Fund" to receive donations and moneys from the public to pay costs incurred by the City in connection with the Olympic Torch Run through the City on June 7, 1996, and other future community events sponsored by the City or in which the City participates.

Section 2. That all moneys deposited to the Community Events Fund are hereby appropriated to pay the costs of the City associated with the Olympic Torch Run and other future community events sponsored by the City or in which the City participates and that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to expend moneys from the Community Events Fund for such purpose from time to time to the extent that moneys are available in such Fund.

Section 3. That this Ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety said emergency being the necessity of paying costs associated with the Olympic Torch Run on June 7, 1996, and shall be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.


