

Ordinance 76-98

ORDINANCE NO. 76 -98

An Ordinance to appropriate \$4,000.00 from the unencumbered Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of school crossing signs to replace existing faded school crossing signs.

WHEREAS, existing school crossing signs are faded and no longer adequately warn motorists of school crossings; and,

WHEREAS, school crossing signs are essential for the safety of school children. NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the amount of \$4,000.00 should be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unencumbered Capital Improvements Fund for the purchase of school crossing signs to replace existing faded school crossing signs.

Section 2. That this Ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being the need to provide the signage at the beginning of the school year, and that this Ordinance shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
