An Ordinance to extend the moratorium on certain uses enacted by Ordinance 61-99 to April 30, 2000.

WHEREAS, this Council imposed a moratorium on certain uses pursuant to Ordinance No. 61-99 pending adoption of a revised Zoning Code; and

WHEREAS, the moratorium expires by its terms on January 1, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the drafting of the revised Zoning Code has not yet been completed, and this Council finds it necessary to extend the moratorium through April 30, 2000, in order to provide additional time for the preparation and consideration of a revised Zoning Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the moratorium on certain uses imposed by Ordinance No. 61-99 is hereby extended until April 30, 2000 on the terms and conditions set forth in Ordinance No. 61-99.

Section 2. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being the necessity to control certain uses pending consideration of a revised Zoning Code by this Council, and shall be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
