

RESOLUTION NO. 7-00

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to file a grant application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the purpose of acquiring funds for landscaping, pedestrian and bike path enhancements, and Alum Creek corridor improvements in this area known as Pump House Park at the southeast corner of Alum Creek Drive and Main Street.

WHEREAS, the City of Bexley has leased from the City of Columbus an open space located at the southeast corner of Main Street and Alum Creek Drive known as "Pump House Park", and

WHEREAS, the City of Bexley wishes to improve the area with landscaping, pedestrian ways, bike path enhancements, and stream corridor improvements, and

WHEREAS, the property owner, the City of Columbus, agrees to and supports the improvements and this application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY, OHIO:

Section 1. That the Council of the City of Bexley hereby endorses and supports landscaping, pedestrian ways, bike path enhancements and stream corridor improvements in the area known as Pump House Park located at the southeast corner of Main Street and Alum Creek Drive.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor are authorized to file a grant application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the purpose of acquiring funds for providing landscaping, pedestrian ways, bike path enhancements and stream corridor improvements at Pump House Park, and if awarded, enter into agreement with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to fund the project as required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and becomes eligible for reimbursement under the terms and conditions of the Nature Works Program.

Section 3. That the City of Bexley hereby requests the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to consider and funds its application.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meeting open to the public in compliance with all requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. That this Resolution is an emergency Resolution necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, said emergency being the need to proceed with the grant application to meet specified deadlines and shall go into effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
