

ORDINANCE No. 81 -02

An Ordinance to ^{appropriate} ~~transfer~~ \$22,800.00 from the unencumbered General Fund to Information Systems accounts as follows: account 0118051132 (Telecommunications) \$11,000; account 0118051140 (Hardware) \$3,000; account 0118051141 (Software Maintenance) \$8,800 and to appropriate said amounts, and to declare an emergency.

WHEREAS, an actual higher increase in Local telephone service rates occurred than what was budgeted for, and

WHEREAS, an increase use of outside network services, and

WHEREAS, an increase in the number of computers that needed repaired or replaced, and

WHEREAS, an unbudgeted mandatory expenditure was required to maintain our Microsoft licenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY:

Section 1. That the amount of \$11,000.00 should be and hereby is ^{appropriated} ~~transferred~~ from the unencumbered General Fund to the Telecommunications account No. 0118051132 and appropriated from the Telecommunication account for the purpose of local and network services.

Section 2. That the amount of \$3,000 should be and hereby is ^{appropriated} ~~transferred~~ from the unencumbered General Fund to the Hardware account No. 0118051140 and appropriated from the Hardware account for the purpose of computer repair.

Section 3. That the amount of \$8,800 should be and hereby is ^{appropriated} ~~transferred~~ from the unencumbered General Fund to the Software Maintenance account No. 0118051141 and appropriated from the Software Maintenance account for the purpose of Software licenses.

Section 4. is an emergency ordinance necessary for the public welfare, said emergency being the need to provide uninterrupted telephone and computer service to Bexley City Hall, and shall take affect upon its signing by the Mayor.


