## ORDINANCE NO 27-10

An ordinance to appropriate \$3,323.50 from Unencumbered General Fund (01), \$835.81 from the Street Maintenance Fund (03), \$2,794.93 from the Recreation Fund (05), \$247.61 from the Water Fund (09) and \$866.56 from the Sewer Fund (10) for the purpose of paying past overtime to certain non-union employees – Total Appropriation \$8,068.43.

Whereas The Fair Labor Standards Act requires that annual longevity bonuses be included in the base hourly rate for the purpose of computing overtime rates; and,

Whereas The annual longevity bonus was not included in the base hourly rate for computing overtime for several current and former non-union employees due to a misunderstanding of the law; and,

Whereas It is the intention of the City to pay the affected employees all the past overtime due them as a result of this misunderstanding.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY

Section 1. That \$3,323.50 is appropriated from the Unencumbered General Fund for the purpose of paying past overtime as follows:

That \$247.61 is appropriated from the Water Fund for the purpose of paying past overtime as follows:

09-365 Water Administration 247.61

That \$866.56 is appropriated from the Sewer Fund for the purpose Section 5. of paying past overtime as follows:

10-367 Sewer Distribution \$ 866.56
