RESOLUTION 2 - 19

A resolution supporting the City of Bexley in applying for a proposed grant through the Solid Waste Authority of Central Ohio in order to incentivize the use of re-usable bags in Bexley.

WHEREAS, numerous studies have shown the negative environmental and health effects of plastics and the chemicals used to produce them; and

WHEREAS, numerous studies have documented the prevalence of plastic carry-out bags littering the environment, blocking storm drains, becoming entangled in tree tops, and fouling beaches; and

WHEREAS, plastic bags and other plastic products are a substantial source of marine debris, responsible for the deaths of tens of thousands of marine animals due to ingestion or entanglement each year; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown the presence of micro plastics in terrestrial and marine life systems throughout the entire planet, resulting in a wholesale contamination of the food supply due to the proliferation of plastic litter and plastic breakdown products; and

WHEREAS, plastic bags cause operational problems at recycling processing facilities, landfills, and transfer stations, and contribute to litter throughout the Columbus region; and

WHEREAS, numerous states and cities throughout the United States have enacted single-use plastic bag and single use plastic bans, resulting in dramatic decreases in plastics waste; and

WHEREAS, major countries throughout the world have banned plastic bags and/or single use plastics, or announced a ban of all single-use plastics by 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bexley, Ohio has the duty to protect the natural environment, the economy and the health of its residents, wildlife and visitors of the city; and

WHEREAS, a core component of the adopted Mission of the City of Bexley is to "Protect, preserve, and enhance Bexley's natural and developed environment"; and

WHEREAS, via proposed Ordinance 14-19, the City hopes to encourage the use of reusable bags as a solution to help curb the negative environmental impact of single use plastic bags; and

WHEREAS, numerous Bexley businesses have shown their support for the proposed ordinance, and have suggested an innovative program to provide a positive incentive to Bexley consumers to reuse bags; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bexley administration is proposing a grant program to assist Bexley businesses in incentivizing consumers to bring their own re-usable bags while shopping, even prior to any proposed mandatory charge for single-use bags; and

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Authority of Central Ohio (SWACO) has been identified as a potential partner in creating such a grant program, with the City of Bexley Refuse Fund also providing support; and

WHEREAS, the next SWACO grant cycle closes in June of 2019; and

WHEREAS, the grant

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEXLEY:

Section 1.

That this Council hereby supports the concept of a grant application to the Solid Waste Authority of Central Ohio, with the following general concept:

- 1. The City will apply for a grant from SWACO for up to \$10,000, and provisionally pledge, subject to City Council approval, up to \$10,000 of matching funds from the Refuse Fund.
- 2. The grant will be used to subsidize a discount/incentive program for customers who bring their own reusable bags to shop at Bexley businesses.
- 3. The grant-funded incentive shall not exceed the lesser of: 50% of the value of the incentive, or \$0.05 per transaction.
- 4. The grant-funded incentive program will expire on June 1, 2020.
- 5. This program, based on this specification, will have the capacity to assist with the incentivization of 400,000 transactions in Bexley in which re-usable bags would be used in lieu of single-use plastic bags.

Section 2.

That this Resolution shall go into effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
