2. Applications to be reviewed -

a. <u>1 Lyonsgate – Craig Tuckerman, Tuckerman Group</u>

Ms. Elena Andrews shared her staff report for 1 Lyonsgate with the Tree Commission. The new build is being constructed on a vacant lot in the Lyonsgate gated community. There were no existing tree or shrubs within the footprint of the house. The plan has been approved by both the Homeowners Association (HOA) of Lyonsgate and the Architecture Review Board (ARB). The plant materials are all appropriate for the site and fit in well with the existing content throughout Lyonsgate. The landscape plan has an irrigation system that will be installed throughout the property.

Mr. Craig Tuckerman presented the landscape before the Tree Commission. The planting material was selected to match the existing plants currently planted throughout the gated community. The style of paver seen throughout Lyonsgate has been discontinued and Overfield Holland paver selected for 1 Lyonsgate matches very closely and has already been installed per plan. Boxwood, liriope and hostas are just a few examples of what will be planted throughout the site. To the west of the property is a small area of grass that will be irrigated. A full list of plant material is attached along with the location of where the plants will be placed. Lyonsgate Community has one landscaping company that takes care of all shrubs, trees, other plant material, and mowing throughout the community. The plants that have been selected for the site have a one year guarantee.

b. <u>Reviewing Design concepts for Broad and Gould – Susan Quintenz,</u> <u>Elena Andrews</u>

Ms. Elena Andrews shared her opinion with the Tree Commission regarding the design of Broad and Gould. She asked that the Tree Commission take into consideration the proportions of the columns if they decide to raise or lower them. A discussion was held among the Tree Commission regarding the different styles of fence suggested for the area and various members believe the design is stronger without a fence. Mr. Dave Wakeman suggested removing the brick and limestone collar and keeping everything ground level with the fence and plant material remaining. Ms. Mollie O'Donnell suggested to remove the rubble, she does not believe it is necessary to make changes to the street to add the design element.

3. Mayor's Report:

Havenwood Landscape Planning - RFP

The City of Bexley has received bids from 4 landscaping companies: Spruce, MKSK, Pod Design, and Landscape Architects. Mayor Kessler and Mr. Bill Dorman will be reviewing the bids.

b. City Council Ordinances:

Tree Stump definition

The definition of a "Tree Stump" has been approved by City Council.

Noxious Weeds Ordinance Updated

The Ordinance has been approved by Council. Mayor Kessler wanted to inform the Tree Commission a small section of the Ordinance has been removed—"excess growth of plants that block vision or is uncultivated." The reason being there is already vision triangle elsewhere in the code and uncultivated was not defined and it felt subjective.

Jeffrey Woods Festival – March 2, 2019

Jeffrey Woods Festival is Saturday March 2, 2019. Mayor Kessler will be out tapping trees at 9 am Saturday February 23, 2019. Yellowwood Axe will be attending the event on March 2 this year. There will be an opportunity to purchase the maple syrup on Arbor day.

d. Dog Park at Schneider Park

Mayor Kessler shared the concept for the landscape plan for the dog park at Schneider Park. The entrance to the park is at Astor and Sheridan. The dog park will be in a wooded area and is less than acre and will be mulched. There will be 4ft high black chain link around the park. A cedar fence will be at the entrance of the park. Two water stations will be available, one near the dog park and one near the parking entrance. All invasion plant species and dead trees have been removed from the area. The dog park is a public park and there will be no charge.

Ms. Kathy Rose questioned if all the trees on the property need to inspected or just those that could or would be affected by the footprint of the new build. Chair Quintenz responded that the Commission would like to see all trees that are 6 inches or larger on the site plan when submitted.

The horn beams that were planted in the Trinity courtyard had been removed and planted over on Sheridan Ave. Capital University is currently working on other landscape plans for both Sheridan and Trinity courtyard and will be presenting them to the Commission in the near future. The preliminary plan includes a labyrinth maze, benches, planting and stone pavers. The screening along Sheridan Ave. will include more plant material and different types of shrubs and trees.
